



Susan B. Anthony (1820 - 1906) was a pioneer for women's suffrage in the United States. Her work helped pave the way for the 19th Amendment to the Constitution giving women the right to vote.

Elizabeth Cady Stanton (1815 - 1902) was an American leader in the women's rights movement and organized the first convention (the Seneca Falls Convention in 1848) to advocate for women's right to vote.
